otoseptiembre USA –SAFOTO, one of the world's largest photography festivals, officially gets un-derway in September and runs Sept. 1 through 30 in San Antonio and other Texas cities. The event, now in its 12th year, features the physical and online gal-leries of Texas photographic artists as well as artists from Argentina, Belgium, Brazil, Poland, Mexico, Uruguay, Switzerland

and other countries.
"And even such faraway places as Oregon, Minnesota and San Antonio's East and West sides," jokes Michael Mehl, fes-

tival director.

The work itself is eclectic and fresh, Mehl said. It includes everything from portraits of refugees in Darfur to a poetry slam performance at the San Antonio Mu-

The poetry slam is in conjunction with the Allen Ginsberg exhibition that runs through Oct. 14 at the San Antonio Museum of Art. That exhibition covers the early and late works of the beat photographer. Ginsberg works include portraits of Jack Keroac and Timothy Leary.

San Antonio photographer Al Rendon captures 20 years of images and antics of some of the greatest rock and roll bands as they traveled to Texas in his exhibit, "All Access: My Rock 'N' Roll," which dis-

plays Sept. 7 through Oct. 31 at Rei don Photography and Fine Art, 733 S. mo St. See Ted Nugent like you have never seen him before in a colorful, beautiful shot performing on stage. Bob Howen's "America the Beauti-

ful . . . We Celebrate, We Remember" brings to life the patriotic landscapes that come to mind when one sings the lyrics "purple mountain's majesty." The San Antonio photographer's exhibit will be on display Sept. 10 through 21 at the Art Incorporated

Gallery of Fine Arts located on 9401 Brent Holbert of Boerne and Matt

Wright-Steel chronicled the daily lives of native bomb hunters for "Residue of Conflict: Laos" which displays Sept. 15 through 29 at the Cibolo Nature Center in Boerne. The two artists traveled to Laos in the winter of 2006 to 2007 and, in addition to documenting what they saw with photographs, they recorded a travel blog that can be found at www.anthrotrek.com. "Fotoseptiembre USA-SAFOTO is

an exhibit-oriented photography fes-tival," Mehl said. "This may seem an obvious statement, but festivals come in many formats these days."


Mehl said the festival does not focus on lectures, conferences, awards, networking, parties or socializing.
