# Fotoseptiembre festival begins

Month-long event to showcase international photographers in S.A.

What started in 1996 as a local group of 12 exhibits and conferences has grown into an international festival celebrating photography and the artists behind it.

Fotoseptiembre USA, an annual month-long photography festival, officially kicks off Monday, Sept. 1, with free-of-charge photo exhibits at venues around San Antonio and in other cities and countries. Photographers participating in Fotoseptiembre USA also can display their works online at fotoseptiembreusa.com, making it a truly global event.

Organizers of Fotoseptiembre USA say the festival is meant to celebrate the photographic art form while giving photographers a venue to showcase their work.

After its low-key start in 1996, Fotoseptiembre USA became an international event in 1998 when organizers were joined by Centro de la Imagen in Mexico City. By 2002, Fotoseptiembre USA hit its peak with 230 artists in 75 exhibits at 62 venues, and it expanded to cities in Peru, Canada, Germany, Belgium, Iran and India.

This year, Fotoseptiembre USA organizers don't have an exact count of the number of artists involved in the festival, although they say it's more than 50 exhibits at close to 50 venues.

To be honest, we stopped counting a long time ago,' said Michael Mehl, Fotoseptiembre


Mehl said the exhibit's large online component and the number of galleries involved make it difficult to track the festival's exact numbers of participants.
