Don't miss our Second Saturday Art & Wine opening reception this Saturday from 4-8pm. Meet photographer, Xill Fessenden who has flown up from Ajjic, Mexico to exhibit her work as part of this year's Fotoseptiembre. Xill has a long trajectory of image making. In the early 1970's she studied art and photography at the Maryland Institute of Art in Baltimore with Master photographers such as Minor White and Imogene Cunningham, as well as the critic, A.D. Coleman. Xill has lived in Mexico since 1985, exhibiting in museums in Mexico City, Guadalajara, Morelia, Tepic and Colima. The body of work that she will present at COSAS during Fotoseptiembre reflects a deep, enduring relationship with the indigenous communities of Mexico. Many of these communities are the same that we go to, to buy from the artists. *El Corazon de Mexico* is Xill's first exhibition in Texas. It will include placing some images in the open air, using the "natural ambiances" as an environmental context. We are honored to have her join us.
