## The City of San Antonio Announces The Year of Taiwan

News Conference to be Held by the Office of Cultural Affairs Announcing a Series of Community-wide Events

## Tuesday August 16, 11am International Center Building 203 S. St. Mary's Street

The City of San Antonio's rich tradition of international collaborations continues as the Office of Cultural Affairs partners with the **Council for Cultural Affairs (CCA), R.O.C., Taiwan** to announce the *Year of Taiwan*. The cultural exchange initiative is an extension of San Antonio's Sister City relationship with Kaohsiung, Taiwan.

A press conference to highlight the *The Year of Taiwan* calendar of events is scheduled for **11am Tuesday, August 16** in the first floor atrium of the International Center Building, located at 203 S. St. Mary's Street. At that time **Mayor Julián Castro** will officially announce the celebration. Also in attendance include; **Yen Chou** from the Taipei Cultural Center of TECO in New York; **John Johnston** from the San Antonio Museum of Art; **Michael Mehl** of FotoSeptiembre USA; and **Felix Padron**, Director of the San Antonio Office of Cultural Affairs.

Beginning this September, San Antonio cultural organizations will celebrate the rich cultural legacy of Taiwan with a series of events and performances featuring a select group of that country's most outstanding traditional and contemporary artists. Highlighting the *Year of Taiwan* will be a major exhibition organized by the San Antonio Museum of Art: *5,000 Years of Chinese Jade*, open from October 1 through February 19, 2012. Felix Padron, director of the Office of Cultural Affairs describes the calendar of events, "In a continued effort to help foster our sister-city relationship, we are proud to present a diverse calendar of performances and world renowned contemporary photographers as well as a first of its kind collection of Chinese jade." In addition to SAMA's 5000 Years of Chinese exhibition, highlights of the *Year of Taiwan* include: **Taipei Folk Dance, FotoSeptiembre photography exhibits featuring Taiwanese artists, 3 Electronic Princes** and **Cloud Gate performance of** *Water Stains***.**
