COSAS exhibition of hallucinatory photos of a glass skull by noted Texas photographer George O. Jackson de Llano opens this Saturday, Sept. 8, as part of the [FOTOSEPTIEMBRE USA's](#) International Photography Festival.

The exhibition, *Tzompantli*, is the product of Jackson's continuing exploration of color and refracted light. It features evocative and haunting photographs of a skull-shaped bottle that recall Aztec skull racks, called *tzompantli*. The photographs also refer to the *calaveras* or skulls in contemporary Mexican and Latin American popular festivals such as Day of the Dead.

Jackson's large-scale *Tzompantli* photographs, printed in panels and individually on canvas, paper, metal, and glass, are the evolution of his ground-breaking work documenting the seasonal religious festivals of the indigenous peoples of Mexico. Called *The Essence of Mexico Collection* and including more than 75,000 images, the photographs are now part of the [Benson Collection of Latin American Art](#) at the University of Texas, Austin, as well as the Latin American Collection at the [San Antonio Museum of Art](#). Photographs from the collection have been shown around the world.

Jackson, who was born and lives in Houston, grew up in Laredo on the Texas-Mexico border, the eldest son of a Mexican mother and Anglo father. He has been taking photographs in Mexico, Texas, and around the world since the 1970s.
