

# MIXED EMOTIONS

An insider's look at Fotoseptiembre USA 2012

For 17 years, the Fotoseptiembre USA International Photography Festival has celebrated photography with a unique and eclectic month long festival during the month of September. International, national, regional, and local artists alike will show off their most prized works of traditional photographs, digital images, photography based works, photographic installations, alternative processes, and everything in between in galleries, museums, art centers and exhibition spaces across San Antonio and the Texas Hill Country.

Enjoy yourself as photographers examine culture, social issues, look inward, outward and onward as they let viewers glimpse into their personal exploration of contemporary notions and emotions with striking simplicity and depth. When the festival was founded, it was with the intent of creating a cultural corridor between Mexico and San Antonio. Throughout the years it has gained interest from artistic communities from around the world. This year's Fotoseptiembre USA 2012 is a far call from what the event started as in 1995. After almost two decades of organizing Fotoseptiembre USA, founder and director Michael Mehl attributes

the festival's success to the immense community participation. For the past five years, Fotoseptiembre USA has partnered with the City of San Antonio's Office of Cultural Affairs and their Sister City Cultural Exchange Initiative to present a series of Signature Exhibits in the galleries of the Instituto Cultural de Mèxico, located in Hemisfair Park. This unprecedented exchange of art and culture can be seen throughout many of the exhibits including "Mixed Metaphors - 13 Queens" by Swiss artists Alex & Felix. It showcases Alex's & Felix's imaginative and surreal worlds that are characterized by the staging that precedes the actual shooting. Another must-see exhibit featured at the Instituto Cultural de Mèxico is "Mixed Metaphors - Stage" by Taiwanese artist Shen, Chao-Liang.

The Signature Exhibits include works of artists from Switzerland, Mexico, Taiwan, New York and Los Angeles. This worldwide interest has resulted in an emphasis on the more experimental approaches to photographic arts, when photographers make use of their camera as an expressive device, and not merely a recording device. The exhibits are filled with breathtaking views that give viewers a unique glimpse into the culture and life of the artist.

Additionally, there are a core group of exhibits, which are produced, curated and presented by Fotoseptiembre USA organizers. These spectacular exhibits are considered the anchor exhibits, and should not be missed. You can find these exhibits at Southwest School of Art, the San Antonio Museum of Art and UTSA. You can also visit Say Si, the Blue Star Contemporary Art Center and Bihl Haus Arts, as well as private galleries such as Gallery Nord and Rendon Photography & Fine Art. These highlights are just a quick peek at the photographic treats that you will encounter. Fotoseptiembre USA 2012 features several hundred artists from around the world in over 60 venues across the San Antonio Area.

Best advice to make the most out of Fotoseptiembre USA 2012? Open your eyes, throw back your head and feel the cool breeze of artistic expression and exploration flow over, under and through your soul.

Fotoseptiembre USA takes place every September. Be sure to explore the eclectic scope of works on exhibition, and maybe even take a piece of art or two home. Aside from the many exhibits on display in San Antonio, galleries in Boerne, Fredericksburg, Kerrville, Spring Branch, Bulverde and New Braunfels will also be showcasing fine photographic works.
